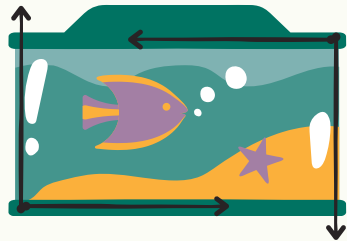
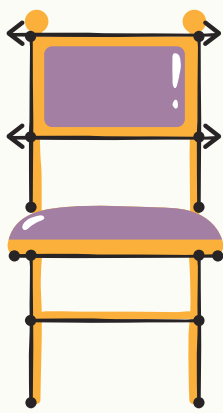


Types of Angles

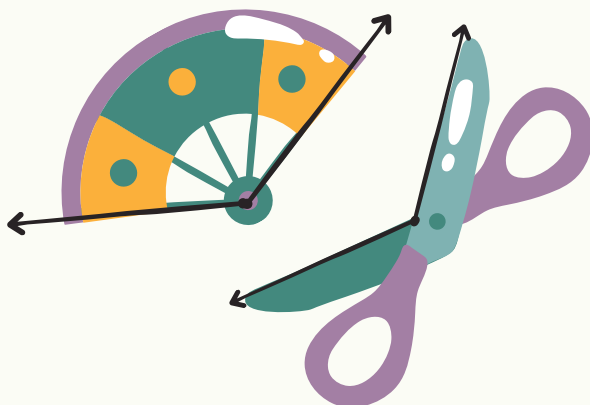
Right Angle

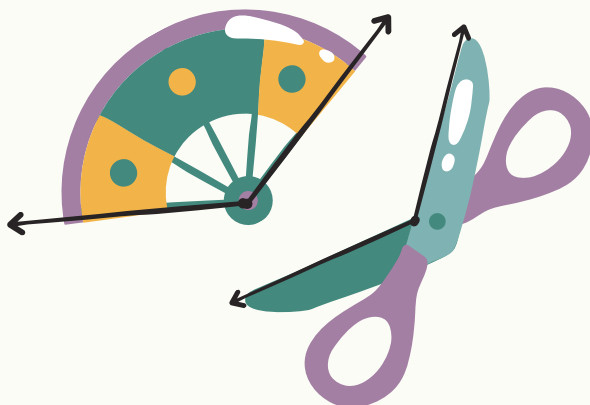
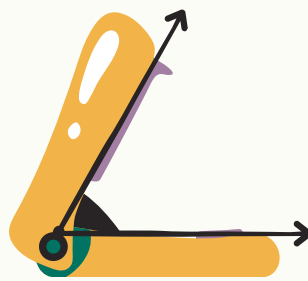


Right Angle

An angle that measures more than 0 but less than 90° .

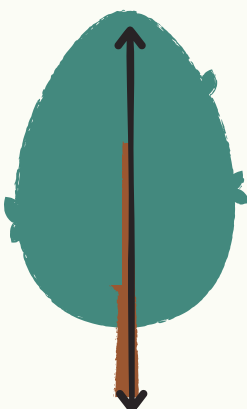
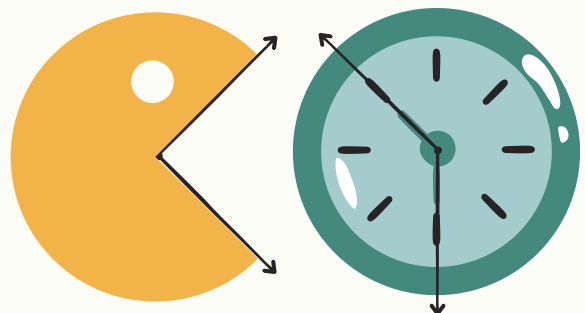


Obtuse Angle
