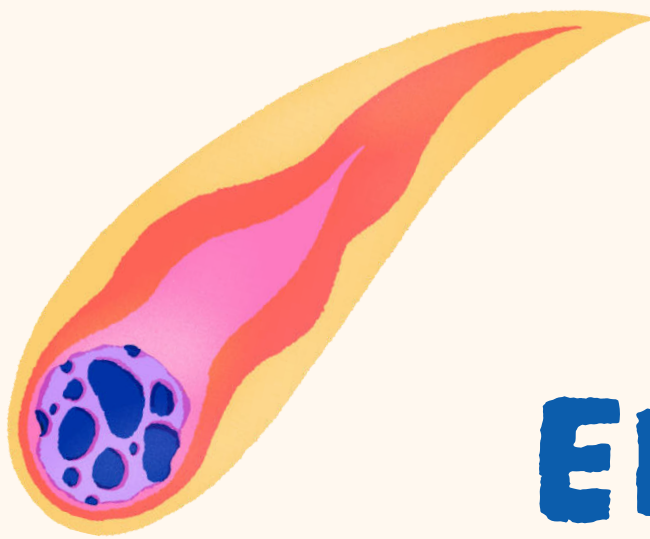

Luna's superpower was the star attraction! She could attract the stars from anywhere in the universe, like magnets, and use them as lights or star beams for transportation.



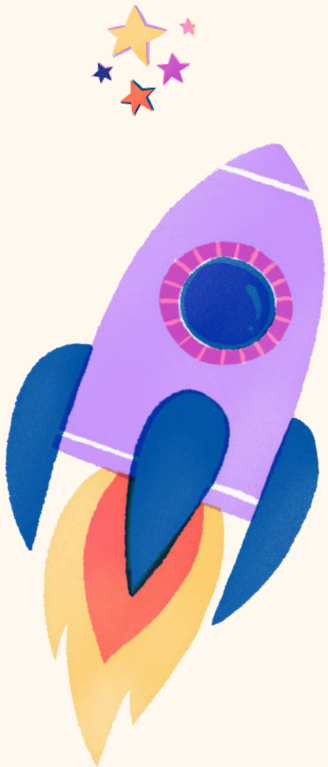
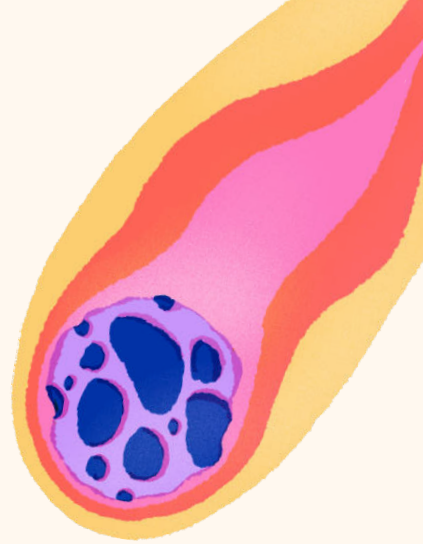


Introduce or build upon the main problem of your story.
