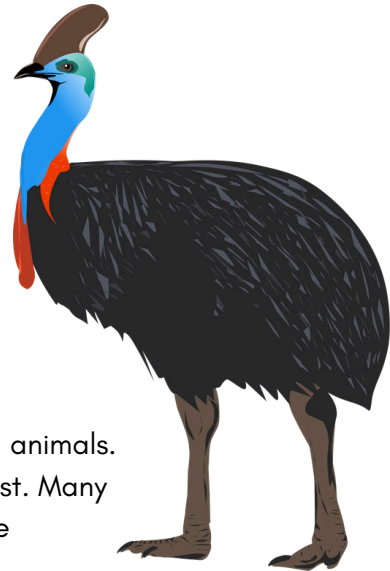
Australian Features of Places
