Homophones are words that sound the same, but have different meanings.



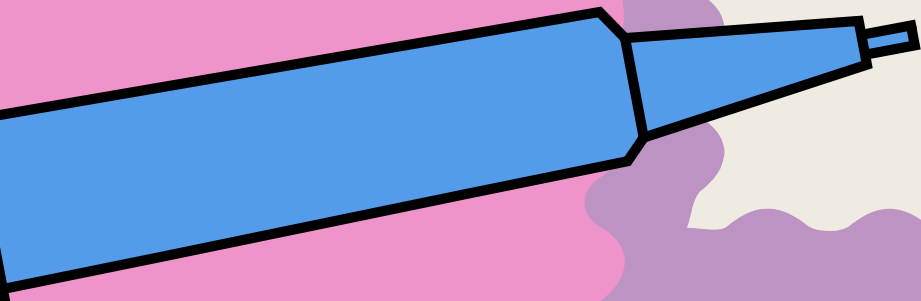
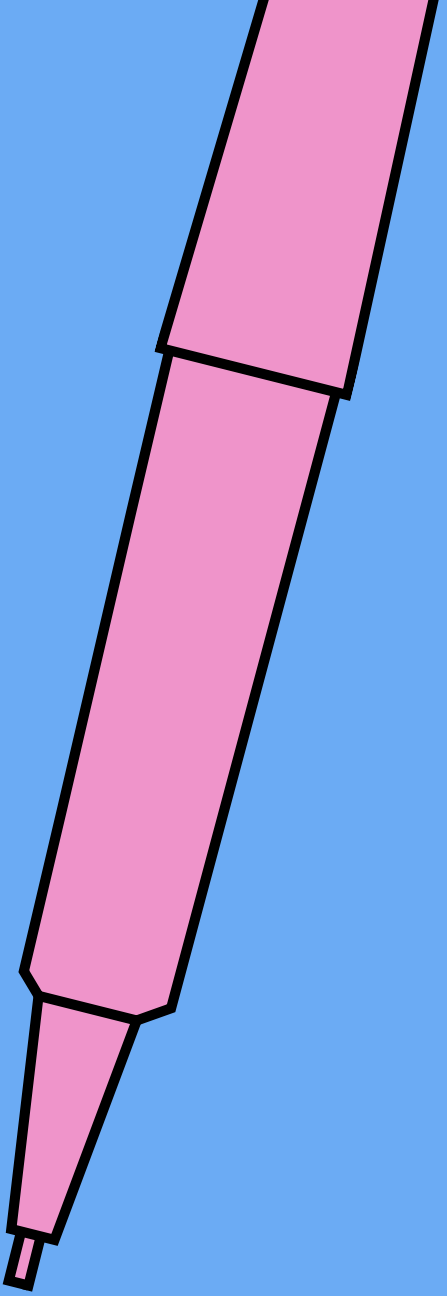

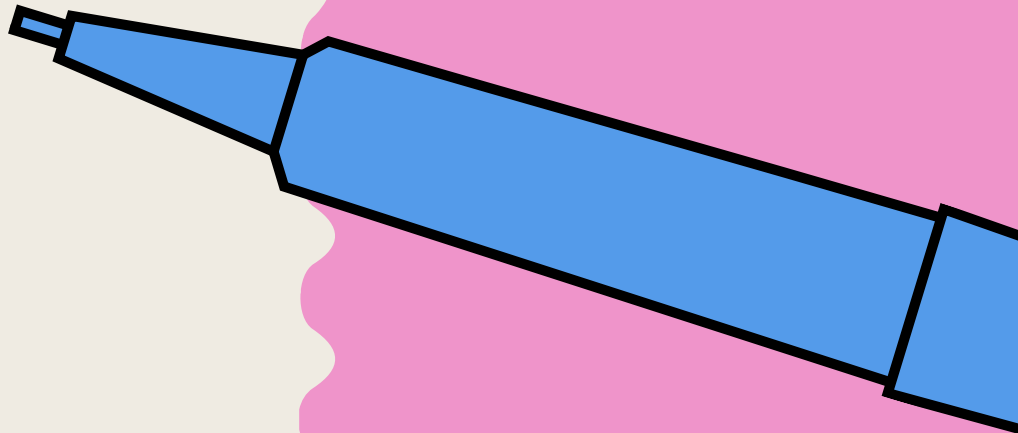
Sometimes homophones can also be spelled the same, like the words rose (noun) and rose (verb).

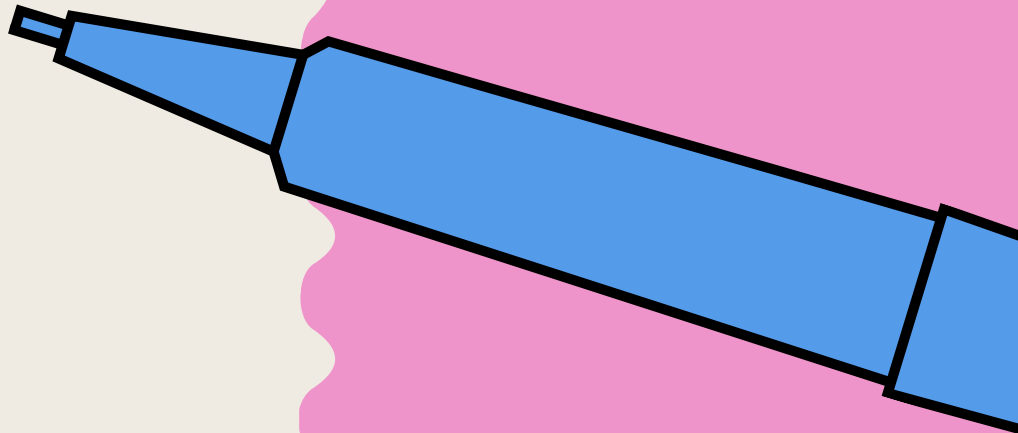


Example
