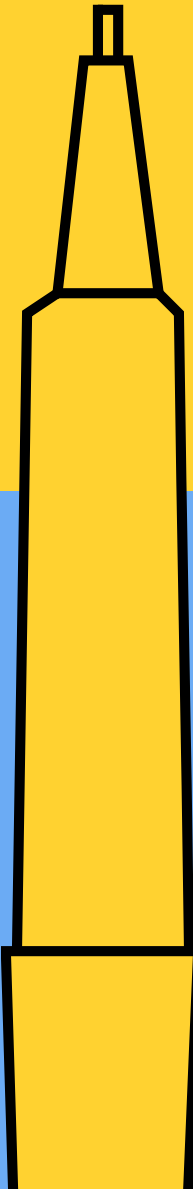
Helping Verbs

Helping Verbs

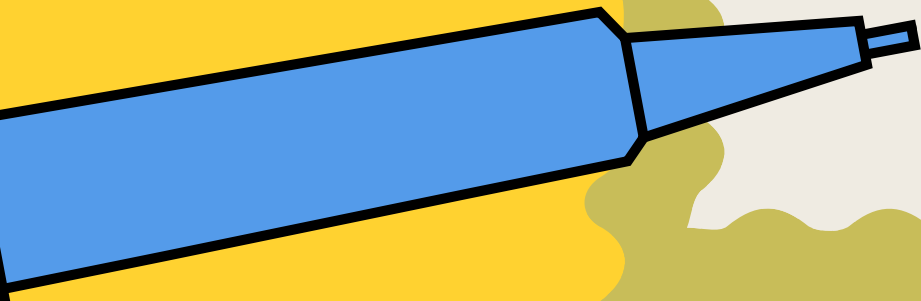
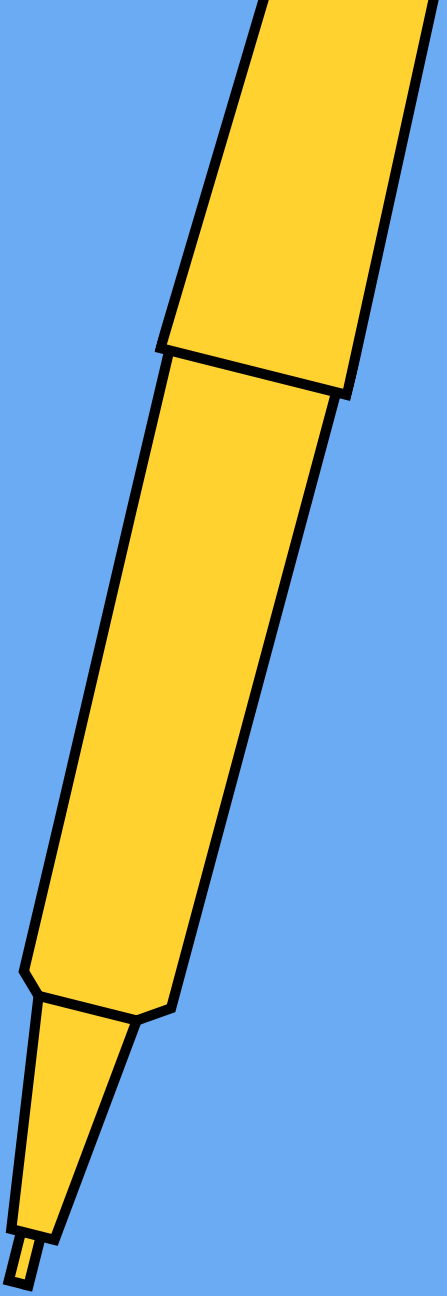


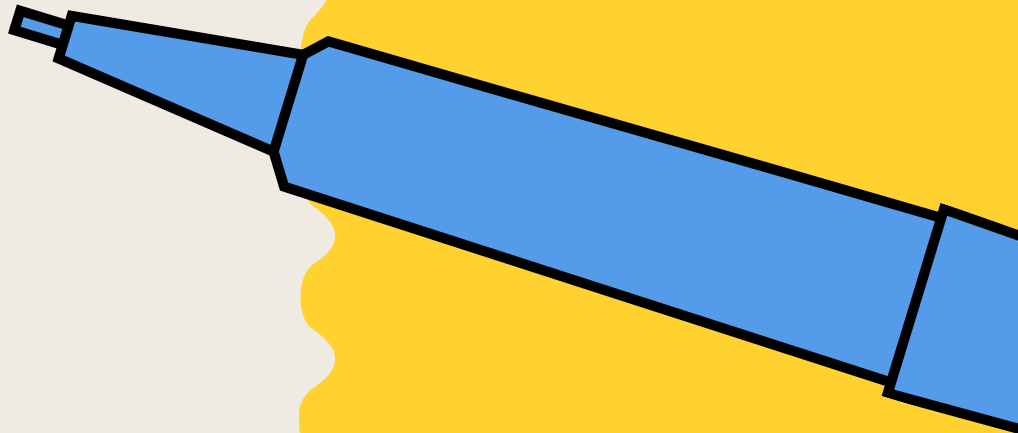
The three most common helping verbs are to be, to have, and to do verbs.

He is walking to school.

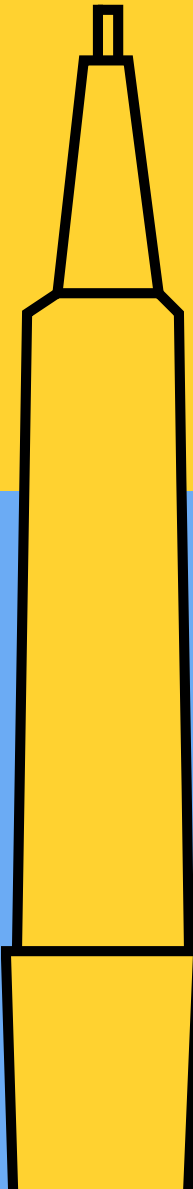
